A history of support

There is a long history of charitable support for the hospitals of Newcastle upon Tyne, setting a foundation for the outstanding quality of care we deliver today.

In 1886, John Fleming, a Newcastle Solicitor gave £25,000 to build a new hospital for sick children in memory of his wife, who had died in 1882.

The Fleming Memorial Hospital at Moor Edge was officially opened by Lord Armstrong on 26 September 1888. In 1988 the work of the hospital was transferred to the Fleming Wing of the Royal Victoria Infirmary and by November 2010, the services and expertise were so specialist and expansive that the Great North Children's Hospital was established.

This is just one example of the important role that legacy gifts have played in supporting the development of our hospitals and in supporting initiatives that help to improve the health and wellbeing of our patients, people and wider communities through compassionate and innovative healthcare, education and research. Throughout the history of our hospitals, the generosity of individuals such as John Fleming have helped to support many aspects of the work of our hospitals and we recognise that a legacy gift is one of the greatest honours we can receive.

Leaving a legacy of any size is a way of becoming part of our future for generations to come. By remembering Newcastle Hospitals Charity in your will, you choose to make a lasting contribution, and to ensure that your values live long into the future.

Types of gifts

You may wish your gift to be used where the need is greatest, in which case, please consider leaving an 'unrestricted gift'. This gives gives the most flexibility for it to be used where it is most needed and makes the biggest difference to the healthcare we provide. Alternatively, please stipulate which particular area of the hospital, or our activities you wish to support.

Choosing the type of gift you want to leave...

There are three common types of gift you can leave to your loved ones and the causes you care about. Whichever you choose and whatever its size, your gift will help to provide the best possible healthcare for future generations.

A cash gift (also known as a pecuniary gift): This is a gift of a specific sum of money. A percentage of your estate (also known as a residuary legacy):

This is a gift of a percentage of all of your estate after the payment of tax, expenses and the distribution of any other bequests.

An item:

This is a gift of any specific non-monetary items such as works of art or other valuables.





Recommended wording for your legacy...

Cash gift:

Percentage gift:

I give % of the residue of my estate to the the Corporate Trustee of Newcastle Hospitals Charity, Charity Number 1057213 of the Charity Office, Peacock Hall, Royal Victoria Infirmary, Newcastle upon Tyne NE1 4LP to apply for the benefit of the Newcastle Hospitals Charity* in such a manner as they in their discretion think fit absolutely but not imposing any binding liability on the Corporate Trustee in this respect.

An item:
